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Section 2 – Answer any 4 out of the following questions. Answers should be brief and to the point. (5 x 4 = 20 points)

1. Who was Samuel? What did the people want him to do for them when they saw King Nahash of the Amorites come against them? Why was Samuel grieved at the people's choice? (L2, p7)

Samuel was a prophet of God who had been dedicated to God from birth by his parents.

The people of Israel asked Samuel to appoint a king to reign over them, like the nations around them.

Samuel was grieved at the people's choice because the Lord wanted to continually guide Israel and be their Savior and Redeemer and king.

2. Why did God send Nathan to David after his adultery with Bathsheba (1 pt)? What parable did Nathan tell David to make him aware of his sin (3 pts)? What was David's response when he realized that he had sinned (1 pt)? (L6, p26)

God sent Nathan the prophet to warn David. He told him the parable of a rich man stealing a lamb from a poor man. David then repented and acknowledged his sin against the Lord.

- 3. What are the 3 promises of God's Covenant with Abraham? (L7, page 32),
 - the promise of land; the promise of descendants; and the promise of blessing and redemption
- 4. Why does Esther avoid the king? (2.5 pts) What was Mordecai's response to Esther? (2.5 pts) (L11, pages 47-48).

Answer: 1. She does not want to tell the King she is a Jew and 2. She fears the law that anyone entering the inner courts without being invited would be put to death.

Mordecai reminds her that she should not hide under the protection of palace and escape the edict. Furthermore, if she did not step up, God would deliver his people through other means and she along with her father's household may not survive the edict.

5. State at least four characteristics of being born again? Lesson 14, page 61.

Answer: 1) Being born again is about being a new creation in Christ. 2) It is about Christ living within you. 3) It is about being trans-formed. 4) A person who is 'born again' should no longer act or behave like they used to. 5) It is about Jesus

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having control over your life rather than yourself. 6) People should see a difference in those who are "born again". 7) We need to submit our lives to Christ in order to enter the Kingdom of Heaven.

6. What did Ananias and Sapphira do after they sold a piece of property? (2.5 pts) Why was their action judged harshly? (2.5 pts) (L15, P64)

Ananias and Sapphira sold a piece of property and brought the money to the apostles. However, they kept a portion of the money to themselves. They wanted to make themselves appear good in front of others. The sin they committed was not that of stinginess and holding back part of the money. Instead, it was that of lying to the Holy Spirit that they gave the whole amount of money when they actually kept part of it for themselves. Thus their action was judged harshly.

Section 5 – Mar Thoma History Short Answer. Answer any two of the following questions. Answers should be brief and to the point. (2 x 5pts = 10 pts Total)

1. List the seven sacraments in the Mar Thoma church. (MTC FV p199)

The Mar Thoma church recognizes seven sacraments. They are

- 1. Baptism
- 2. Confirmation
- 3. Confession
- 4. Holy Qurbana
- 5. Marriage
- 6. Ordination
- 7. Extreme Unction

These features identify the Eastern orientation of the Mar Thoma church.

- 2. List any five reformations Abraham Malpan made in the Malankara church. (MTC FV p211)
 - Started celebration of Holy Qurbana in Malayalam (until then liturgy was in Syriac)
 - Removed sections from Thaksa (Communion service book) that were not based on the Word of God
 - Decided to serve bread and wine separately
 - Made the liturgy as a book available for the use of common people to deepen their understanding and participation in worship
 - Stopped the practice of private confession with the priest and receiving absolution before communion.
 - Holy Communion is for participation and not for worship
 - Removed prayers for the dead
- 3. List and explain any five elements or components of worship used in the Mar Thoma Church (MTC FV P198-199)
 - Liturgy Eucharist (Holy Qurbana) is the central part of it
 - Symbolism place of worship is build east-west, the altar (Madhbaha) towards east, direction of sun, a symbol of risen Christ, the son of righteousness and His second coming. Altar represents the "Throne of God" or the "Table of life"
 - Candles symbolizing the presence of God who is the source of light, also reminding we are the light of the world
 - Incense symbolizes the offering of our prayers to God as sweet smelling sacrifice
 - Vestments represent the fight against the powers of darkness (Ephesians 6:14)
 - Gestures Represent the external expression of the inner experience of penitence, submission and respect in the presence of God

SECTION 6 - Essay—choose one of the following two topics to write an essay in 150-250 words. (1x10 pts=10 pts).

1. Who was Saul? What was the life changing experience that happened to him on his way to Damascus? Explain the spiritual transformation that took place in his life. (L13, p55-57)

Saul was a devout Jew who was very proud of his Jewish heritage. His passion for his religion made him blind towards the teachings of Jesus Christ. He was determined to wipe out Christianity from the face of the earth. So he obtained permission from the High Priest to visit Damascus and take the Christians from there as prisoners to Jerusalem.

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As he was approaching Damascus a bright light from heaven flashed around him and he was blinded. He also heard a voice speaking to him, "Saul, Saul why do you persecute me?" When he realized that it was Jesus whom he was persecuting, his life was changed forever. Saul was blind for three days after which God arranged His servant Ananias to help Saul regain his sight and prepare Saul for His ministry.

Saul who had set out to destroy early Christians became a great advocate for Christianity. Saul's radical transformation changed the history of the Christian church. He became the greatest missionary of all time. God used Saul's talents, religious knowledge, the prestige and power he gained through Roman citizenship, and his secular knowledge to gain more people to His kingdom.

2. How did God use Joshua to win the battle of Jericho? What was their battle strategy? Whose lives did they spare and why? (L10, p 42-44)

The Lord told Joshua that he had handed Jericho over to the Israelites along with its king and soldiers. God instructed the Israelites to march around the walls of Jericho. They circled the city as a procession. The order of the procession was as follows: soldiers, priests, the ark, and then more soldiers. The ark represented the presence of the Lord. The blowing of the trumpets in Israel reminded the people of God's activity for them. The warriors and the priests were to remain silent as they circled around the city each day except on the seventh day. God evidently used this strategy to impress on the people of Jericho as well as on the Israelites, that the deliverance was not by human might or power, but by the spirit of God. God commanded the final shout on the seventh day to announce the destruction of the wall. It was the shout of joy and victory for the Israelites. The uniqueness of this approach impressed upon the Israelites their reliance on God for the victory. It involved incredible faith and obedience.

The Israelites were then to burn the cities and kill the inhabitants including the cattle. The only objects they were to spare were metal, gold, silver and vessels from bronze and iron. These were to be placed in the treasury of the tabernacle. But Rahab the prostitute, with all who belonged to her, were spared by Joshua because she hid the messengers whom Joshua sent to spy out Jericho.
